Anticipated program for this is as follows:

7.45 am SHARP start – Orientation and demonstration of what riders will be aiming for on the day. Gavin's aim is for riders to have a better understanding how to move all parts of the horse's body on the ground (ground work) & ridden. He will be focusing on individual rider's requirements. If you are experiencing any difficulties with any aspects of your ground or ridden work or simply wish to further your relationship with your horse then this clinic will be of benefit.

8.30– 10.30 Riders meet in under covered area un-saddled, do ground work

10.30—11.00 Morning Tea

11.00 –12.30 Riders to meet in under covered area saddled for ridden work

12.30 -- 1.00 lunch, Question time during lunch break

1.00 –3.00 Riders to meet saddled in under covered area for session 2

3.00 – Afternoon Tea and an OPEN discussion & help relating to what has been learnt on the day
